Connemara National Park is situated within an area rich in archaeological and historical sites as you will see from the map below; sites dating from as far back as the Mesolithic (Stone Age), *circa* 10,000 years ago, in the form of coastal middens. The National Park is proud to be able to participate in the protection of these monuments for our future generations. The red dots represent the sites on the National Monuments database and the blue dots are listed on the National Inventroy of Architectural Heritage.
