


555555 Located within the world-famous Killanney National Park, Mucknoss House is situated in beautiful surnoundings, close to the eastern shores of the Mucknoss on Middle Lake. Completed in 1843, the House was built for Henry Arthur Herbert of Mucknoss and his Scottish wife Many Balfour. The Henbert family crest incorporated a mythical dragon-like beast, known as the Chyvern. This creature formed the inspiration for Herbie Herbert, the imaginary character who dwells among the pages of this activity book. The English Queen Victoria was among the many guests who were entertained at Muckross House by the Herbert family. She spent two nights at Muckross during her visit to Killarney in August 1861. The Crincent family owned Mucknoss during the early part of the 20th century. One of their most famous guests was the Irish poet William Butler Yeats. The family later gifted Mucknoss to the Irish people and it became Ireland's very tirst National Park on January 1, 1933.


Your Guide Today will be Herbie Herbert.






This is Herbie Herbert, the Muckross Dragon. He lives in Muckross House. The Herbert family once owned Muckross. They adopted Herbie when he was very young.






She wanted to meet Herbie, but he was shy and hid away.










Lots of people once worked at Muckross House.

and Servant Boys.








Herbie is trying to draw the big bird from the wallpaper in the Billiard room. Can you help him add the tail and feathers?




Colour this bird as you would like it to appear on the wallpaper in your bedroom.




This pretty mirror is decorated with blue glass. It hangs in the Drawing-room of Muckross House. Pretend you are looking into the mirror and draw your reflection.




Herbie loves to watch the native Irish Red Deer that roam the landscape close to his home.










The Vincent family welcomed many guests to Muckross during the 1920s, including the famous Irish poet William Butler Yeats.
